China's Canola Tariffs Concern All Canadians - Canadian Chamber of Commerce To all our friends and colleagues in agriculture and agri-food, including those recently impacted by additional canola tariffs,

On behalf of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce and our Chamber Network across the country, we're with you. You've been caught between a trade war on two fronts for months. Not only are you navigating U.S. tariffs with the rest of the country, but you've taken the brunt of China's retaliation for Canada aligning with the U.S. on matters unrelated to agriculture.

China's tariffs have created uncertainty in an industry that does not have the luxury of pivoting when trade dynamics

change on a dime. Crop planning is difficult when you have no idea what the state of our relationship with one of Canada's largest agricultural markets will be.

Agriculture is an integral piece of our national fabric. It feeds our communities, supports rural livelihoods, sustains jobs across supply chains — whether transportation, processing, retail or support services — and delivers food to our trade partners. This situation affects our country from West to East, touching the lives of all Canadians. In 2024, agriculture and agri-food directly contributed around 7% to Canada's GDP, supported 2.3 million jobs across



the supply chain, and accounted for over one-tenth of Canada's goods exports. The canola industry alone represents 200,000 jobs and \$43 billion for the Canadian economy. Simply, we are united by our country's economic stability, health, and prosperity. When key sectors struggle or are destabilized, we all feel the pain.

Governments at all levels must play their part in resolving this. We must work toward restoring vital market access, advancing opportunities for export diversification, and ensuring support systems are in place to help those affected.

These are trying times. But history has shown us the resilience of Canada's agricultural sector — and our collective strength as a nation. You have our unwavering support and are not alone. The Canadian Chamber of Commerce is actively working with partners across the agricultural and business communities to pursue immediate relief and to durably connect Canada's high-quality goods with new markets. 


